

#### **History of Veterans Day**

#### 1919

World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" – officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France.

However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the **eleventh** hour of the **eleventh** day of the **eleventh** month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..."

The original concept for the celebration was for a day observed with parades and public meetings and a brief suspension of business beginning at 11:00 a.m.

#### 1938

An Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday—a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor Veterans of World War I,

#### 1954

In 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the Veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With

the approval of this legislation (Public Law 380) on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American Veterans of all wars.

Later that same year, on October 8th, President Dwight D. Eisenhower issued the first "Veterans Day Proclamation" (PDF) which stated: "In order to insure proper and widespread observance of this anniversary, all Veterans, all Veterans' organizations, and the entire citizenry will wish to join hands in the common purpose. Toward this end, I am designating the Administrator of Veterans' Affairs as Chairman of a Veterans Day National Committee, which shall include such other persons as the Chairman may select, and which will coordinate at the national level necessary planning for the observance. I am also requesting the heads of all departments and agencies of the Executive branch of the Government to assist the National Committee in every way possible."

#### 1968

The Uniform Holiday Bill (Public Law 90-363 (82 Stat. 250)) was signed on June 28, 1968, and was intended to ensure three-day weekends for Federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day, and Columbus Day. It was thought that these extended weekends would encourage travel, recreational and cultural activities and stimulate greater industrial and commercial production. Many states did not agree with this decision and continued to celebrate the holidays on their original dates.

#### 1971


The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on October 25, 1971. It was quite apparent that the commemoration of this day was a matter of historic and patriotic significance to a great number of our citizens, and so on September 20th, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed Public Law 94-97 (89 Stat. 479), which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of November 11, beginning in 1978. This action supported the desires of the overwhelming majority of state legislatures, all major veterans service organizations and the American people.

#### **Today**

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.

#### How Our Three Points Community Thanksgiving Got Its Start

Before 2013, various groups and individuals in our community, banded together to help families enjoy special holiday meals at Thanksgiving and

Christmas. This happened with gifts and volunteers from Serenity Baptist Church, the Altar Valley School District, the Three Points Food Pantry, Tucson Community Food Bank, Trico Electric Cooperative, 4-H Clubs, the Three Points Fire Department, Friends of Robles Ranch, the Holiday Share Program and community individuals.

These dinners were sometimes actual boxes of food, at other times they were gift cards at local Tucson groceries. Each year that had translated into 10 to 20 families receiving needed assistance. All the families helped were members of the wider Three Points community

So in 2013, for a variety of reasons and following the creative idea of Patzi Hughes at Serenity Baptist Church and then District Fireman and School Board President, Mr. Bobby Ethridge, and the participating agencies decided to provide an actual community Thanksgiving meal on Thanksgiving Day itself.

The normal contributions were used to purchase food so that individuals and families can enjoy this meal together for free. Volunteers and local chefs cooked, served and cleaned up after the meal. The lead team for the preparation of that meal was Sodexo Food services who was then working for the Altar Valley School

District. That Company generously offered to supply the turkey for the meals and the cooks to prepare it with the help of our local "Chefs".

Fast forward to today.

The Altar Valley School District generously allows the use of the Robles Elementary School cafeteria.

The food for this Thanksgiving meal is donated by an anonymous community member.

Virginia Turner, General Manager of Dining Services prepares all the food.

The food is served by our wonderful members of the Three Points Fire District.

The planning team member are Dr David Dumon, Superintendent Altar Valley School District, Abby Ethridge, Three Points Fire District, Virginia Turner, Altar Valley School District and Patzi Hughes from Serenity Baptist Church.

Pies are baked by now Retired Captain Bobby Ethridge.

Tabes decorations are done by Robles Elementary students under the guidance of the art teachers.




