### Understanding & Navigating Property Taxes



Property taxes can be confusing, and let us be honest, darn right frustrating to understand, but they are a crucial part of what keeps Pima County infrastructure funded. The Pima County Board of Supervisors voted to keep the rate the same as last Fiscal Year at \$5.1048, which is comprised of Primary Property Tax, Library District Tax, Regional Flood Control District Tax, and Debt Services.

Monsoon rains help quench the thirst of summer plants.

#### Tip of the Month

Herbs are one of the easiest plants to grow in your garden or in containers. Warm-season herbs — both perennial and annual — should be in abundance at this time of year. Rosemary, mint, lemon balm, sage, basil, lavender, thyme and oregano thrive in warm weather. Harvest them in the early morning when the essential oil levels are highest. Use some of this bounty to create a refreshing summer mocktail or a favorite cocktail.

Mint is always a favorite when muddled to make mojitos or mint juleps. It is a vigorous spreader, so plant it in a pot.

To make a flavorful tea, steep herbs in boiling water for a few minutes then drain and serve over ice. To sweeten, make a simple syrup by combining equal parts water and sugar or honey and heat until the sugar dissolves.

You also can use simple syrup infused with a sprig of basil for example, add a few strawberries and serve with sparkling water over ice.

#### **Planting**

Plant native and low-water-use species now, when summer rains make digging easier.

Plant palms, whose root systems thrive when planted in the heat.

Plant bougainvillea, yellow bells, oleanders, acacias, cassias, mesquites and palo verdes.

#### **Pruning**

Prune back any surviving tomato plants.

Deadhead bedding flowers.

Vincas that wilt but do not recover with a deep watering should be discarded.

#### Harvesting

Pick okra and squash regularly to keep plants producing until frost.

#### **Fertilizing**

Fertilize citrus toward the end of the month.

Feel free to stop by and take a look!!

Avoid fertilizing frost-tender shrubs now, as this will encourage new growth that may freeze later.

Look for plants with chlorosis — yellow leaves and green veins. Treat plants with an application of chelated iron.

Give roses a late-summer application of specially formulated rose food.

#### Watering

Water citrus deeply once a week or more. Too much water can result in chlorosis.

Water summer-blooming flowers and shrubs.

Water large, established cacti and succulents every 5 weeks if rains have been scarce.

Small specimens benefit from watering every 3-4 weeks.

Ocotillo canes cover themselves with green leaves during the monsoon season. Adding extra watering in between storms can stimulate new growth.

#### **Blooming**

Red bird of paradise produces showy clusters of brilliant red and orange blossoms until frost. The fern-like foliage adds a tropical look to desert gardens.

#### **Transplanting**

Set out transplants of basil, chives, lemon verbena and nasturtiums.

The magic formula: Pick 1 from each of the following categories:

1 protein + 1-2 fruits + 1 veggie + 1 dairy + 1 crunchy snack + 1 small sweet.

#### **Protein**

- Ham and mayo on wheat bread
- Turkey roll-ups on tortilla
- Salami slices
- Tuna salad (on bread or with crackers to dip)
- Egg salad
- Pasta salad with white beans
- Sunbutter and jelly sandwich
- Roasted chicken shreds
- Chicken nuggets and dipping sauce
- Hard-boiled eggs
- Jerky
- Chia pudding made with coconut milk
- Baked tofu with teriyaki sauce
- Dumplings
- Fried rice
- Edamame
- Roasted chickpeas with cinnamon and salt

 Hummus and dippers, like pita chips or carrot sticks

#### Fruit

- Berries
- Apples (a squeeze of lemon juice helps them stay fresh)
- Bananas
- Oranges
- Grapes (halved)
- Watermelon
- Pineapple
- Pear
- Mango (fresh or dried)
