ALLY targets LGBTQ+ and allied youth between the ages of 13 and 24 and builds their skills through two evidence-based interventions (1) the Sources of Strength curriculum for youth and (2) Question, Persuade, & Refer training for the community.

SALA's Homeowner and Tenant Protection Program is designed to ensure the maximum number of people are helped by utilizing a tiered level of services which are: first level—legal advice and counseling; second level—brief services; and third level—advanced services up to representation in court or administrative hearings such as Section 8 Voucher hearings. Potential clients can access SALA's service by applying online, by phone, or in person.
